

# Transportation Options

## U-M Buses

The University of Michigan operates its own line of buses that anyone can ride **free** of charge. Blue U-M buses have “University of Michigan” written in large letters on the side, and run between Central, South, Medical and North Campuses. Blue buses and smaller white U-M buses also run between the various buildings of the U-M Health System (including the East Ann Arbor Health Center) and stop at nearby parking lots. ## Ann Arbor Transit Authority (AATA) TheRide

Ann Arbor operates a public bus system, **TheRide**, <http://www.theride.org/>. The bus services the Ann Arbor and Ypsilanti area.

University of Michigan students, faculty and staff can ride the buses for free by swiping a valid Yellow MCard (University of Michigan ID).

For those students who do not have a yellow MCard, the cost is **\$1.50** for a fixed rate. The fare can be paid in cash or with AATA bus tokens. Tokens can be purchased online or in person at the Blake Transit Center. Tokens can also be purchased in person at the Michigan Union Ticket Office. If you do not have exact change for your trip on our fixed route buses, ask the driver for a change card. Change cards are issued for amounts of \$0.25 cents or more and are not redeemable for cash.

## Taxis

Taxis are a convenient but more expensive way to get around Ann Arbor. Cabs can get you around Ann Arbor, but keep in mind that we are not a big city where you can hail a taxi at every corner. It is best to call at least one hour ahead in order to make sure that you arrive at your destination on time. You can often find taxis waiting on State Street outside of the Michigan Union.

Ann Arbor is home to many different taxi cab companies. ## Parking

**Republic Parking System**, 734-761-7235, operates parking and related issues for the City of Ann Arbor. Meter cash cards can be purchased at a Republic Parking office at 324 Maynard or in the Ann & Ashley structure.

## Parking Structures

City -owned and Downtown Development Authority (DDA)-managed parking facilities are marked by white signs with a green letter P (lots) or blue signs with a white P.

- **Maynard Structure**, 324 Maynard Street. There is also an entrance on Division.
- **Liberty Square Structure**, 510 E. Washington Street.
- **Library Lane Structure**, 319 S. Fifth Avenue.
- **Fourth & Washington Structure**, 123 E. Washington Street.
- **Fourth & William Structure**, 115 E. William Street.
- **Forest Structure**, 650 Forest Street.
- **Ann Ashley Structure**, 220 N. Ashley Street.
- **South Ashley Lot**, 305 S. Ashley.
- **First & Huron Lot**, 201 W. Huron Street.
- **Fifth & Huron Lot**, 115 S. First Street.
- **First & William Lot**, 300 First Street.
- **415 W Washington Lot**, 415 W Washington.

# Parking Meters

Parking is difficult in Ann Arbor. Rates range from \$1.20 per hour to \$1.70 per hour. Check <http://rpsa2.com/Location-and-Rates> for locations and rates. The fine for an expired meter may range from \$6 to \$10 depending on the meter. Fines continue to increase if not paid by the next business day. Your car might be towed after three unpaid fines or if you park in an unauthorized area.

Gray parking meters belong to the City of Ann Arbor and are enforced Mondays through Saturdays between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m., except holidays. Parking time limits are posted on meters or shown on the screen at the ePark kiosk. Legal parking durations vary from 30 minutes to 10 hours. Rates in the downtown and campus area are \$1.60/hour.

Some meters have been converted to solar-powered "**e-park**" pay stations. Each pay station is located near a group of spaces. You can pay and add time at any machine. E-park machines accept coins and credit or debit cards. Meter cash cards can be purchased at the **Republic Parking office** at 324 Maynard or at the Ann & Ashley structure.

Maize and blue meters belong to the UM and have the same times of enforcement. Most meters around Central Campus (Michigan Union area) are two-hour meters. You can find some four-hour meters on Madison Street between Packard and State.
